

Risk Assessment Guidance



The assessor can assign values for the hazard severity (a) and likelihood of occurrence (b) (Taking into account the frequency and duration of exposure) on a scale of 1 to 5, then multiply them together to give the rating band:

Likelihood	Severity
1 – Remote	1 – Trivial (No absence)
2 – Unlikely (occurs rarely)	2 – Minor (Periodic absence up to 1 week)
3 – Possible (could occur but uncommon)	3 – Moderate (Periodic absence up to 1 month)
4 – Likely (recurrent but not frequent)	4 – Serious (Periodic absence 1-6 months)
5 – Very likely (occurs frequently)	5 – Very Serious (Long term ill health over 6 months)

The severity should provide some guidance as to the risk of stress related hazards which could potentially lead to a Period of ill health

The University has taken the view that the Severity for all hazards relating to Coronavirus will be scored as 4 across the board.

LOW RISK (1 – 8)	MEDIUM RISK (9 - 12)	HIGH RISK (15 - 25)
Continue, but review periodically to ensure controls remain effective	Continue, but implement additional reasonable practicable controls where possible and monitor regularly	-STOP THE ACTIVITY- Identify new controls. Activity must not proceed until risks are reduced to a low or medium level
