

We also offer a Foundation Degree option alongside top-class undergraduate and postgraduate degrees across a range of subjects. Judo also runs a DiSE programme (Diploma in Sporting Excellence).

Our Dual Career programme is designed to support athletes who want to succeed at sport and in their studies. Scholarships are available to athletes who have shown potential to do well academically and athletically.

Our Student Performance Sport Programmes for those competing at British Universities & Colleges Sport (BUCS) at a high level, are underpinned by expert support services including high-quality coaching, physiotherapy, sports psychology, sports massage and strength and conditioning.

Our team has approximately 20 athletes training full-time. We compete at BUCS, the Olympic Games and everything in between. Some of the world's top judoka including Olympic medallists Gemma Gibbons and Kate Howey as well as double Olympian Ben Fletcher and 2020 Olympians Megan Fletcher and Prisca Awiti Alcaraz have trained at Team Bath. Gemma Howell, who studied and trained at Bath, went on to become European Champion.


Facilities

Our judo programme is based at the £35 million Team Bath Sports Training Village and facilities include:

- Modern and world-class dojo, designed in a traditional Japanese style
- A large, well-equipped gym spread across three floors with discounted memberships
- · Studios for fitness classes
- 400m international outdoor athletics track
- 130m indoor sprint track
- · Indoor throws and jumps hall
- 3 multi-purpose sports halls
- A 50m swimming pool
- 8 indoor and 10 outdoor tennis courts (hard and clay)
- Hockey, rugby and football pitches
- A 3G training strip
- Physio and sport science centre
